Follow and share these tips to keep the road safe for all travelers:

- Put your cell phone away until you reach your destination even hands-free devices
- Wait until the car is fully stopped to adjust a radio, MP3 player, or CD player
- Never multi-task with activities like eating, grooming, or using a navigation system
- Check your blind spots often before turning or changing lanes
- Attempt eye contact with cyclists before turning in their direction at intersections
- Some motorcycle signals aren't self-canceling ensure the rider turns before proceeding
- Treat motorcycles like passenger vehicles: allow them a full lane width
- Follow the 4-second rule: don't pass an object until at least 4 seconds after a cyclist in front of you
- Be a defensive driver: try to anticipate a cyclist's next move
